High School Credit Information

- * You need 28 credits to graduate from the Alpine School District.
- * Each term you earn .25 credits for each class you pass with a D- or higher.
- * Anytime you fail a class you miss out on earning .25 credits.
- * There are 8 credits available in 9th grade (7 credits available for Seminary students).
- * Certain amounts of these credits need to come from specific subjects.
- * Students who <u>failed even once</u> in English, Math, World Geography/Civilizations, Biology, Earth Systems, or P.E. are behind on credit. This must be made up before the end of 12th grade.
- * Seminary students who failed any class are behind on credit.

Options to make up High School Credit

- 1. **Make up work with individual teachers:** If your final grade at the end of a term is between 50-59%, you should work with your teacher to see if you can make up work to earn a D- and .25 credit. *This must be done immediately after the term ends*. Remember, this is at the discretion of the teacher and may not be a possibility but it is in your best interest to try.
- 2. **Summer School**—Alpine School District offers extended year classes at Mountain View and Lehi High schools. Cost is \$25.00 per class and each class is worth .25 credits. You can do up to six classes per summer to make up credit or get ahead in credit. There is limited seating in each class on a first come/first served basis. Contact your counselor for more information.
- 3. Attend **East Shore High School** (801-610-8185). Registration costs \$115.00 for full time students. Part time students pay \$5.00 per packet. Each packet takes approximately 15 hours, and is worth 1/8 credit. This option would only be for students who are far behind on credits and motivated to work on their own. If you are interested, talk to your counselor first. Visit <u>eastshorehs.com</u> for more details.
- 4. **BYU Independent Study** courses are available to make up credit. For information see the web site at <u>elearn.byu.edu</u> or call 801-422-2868. Classes award .50 credits and take approximately 60-80 hours to complete. The cost is \$280 per .50 credits. All courses are self-directed and tests are taken at local testing centers.

9.5 Electives (or any extra credits from any required subject)

5. Students who fail an elective can make up credit in 10^{th} , 11^{th} , or 12^{th} grade through **earning more than 7 credits** each year.
